Why GenNET Online Learning?

The goal of GenNET Online Learning is to equip Michigan school districts with a wide variety of cost-effective options to meet and enhance curriculum standards.



What are the benefits?

- ◆ Hundreds of course offerings delivered over the Internet for high school and middle school students.
- ◆ Schools and students have access to cost-effective opportunities from a variety of providers to meet the new high school graduation requirements. These opportunities enhance local curriculum and support diverse learning styles.
- ◆ Barriers such as time, space, and equality of opportunity diminish with web-based courses.
- ◆ For most GenNET Online Learning courses, students will access and complete assignments, practice exercises, quizzes, and tests completely online, allowing for continuous feedback.
- ◆ Students can interact with classmates and the instructor through online discussion groups.
- ◆ Access to quality online resources and classroom support tools is provided.
- ◆ Knowledge and expertise is included from GenNET/Genesee Intermediate School District (GISD) staff, who have been leading this online project for nearly 10 years.

What GenNET Online courses are available?

- ◆ GenNET offers a wide selection of high school and middle school courses delivered over the Internet, including general education, honors, advanced placement, and credit completion. See the complete list at www.gennet.us. Students must work with their school counselor for course selection and eligibility.

Who can take GenNET Online courses?

- ◆ Students should contact their school principal or counselor for information.
- ◆ Visit www.gennet.us for minimum technical requirements.

Do web-based courses have a teacher?

- ◆ Students will have an online teacher.
- ◆ Students can email their teacher anytime.
- ◆ Students will be assigned a mentor from their home school to assist with questions or problems.

Do students have to be computer experts to take GenNET Online courses?

Students need to know how to:

- ◆ Use a mouse and keyboard
- ◆ Launch a browser
- ◆ Access the Internet
- ◆ Send and receive email
- ◆ Open, close, and save files

Are online courses easy?

Web-based instruction is very challenging and time intensive. Students should expect to spend more time on these courses than their regular courses. Students who have success in online learning are usually:
